Seventh Annual Conference: "*Technology Intensity and Global Competitiveness*" (Symbiosis International University, Pune November 30 – 2nd December, 2012)

The Seventh Annual Conference was hosted by the Symbiosis International University Pune, and the conference was held at their Lavale campus.
